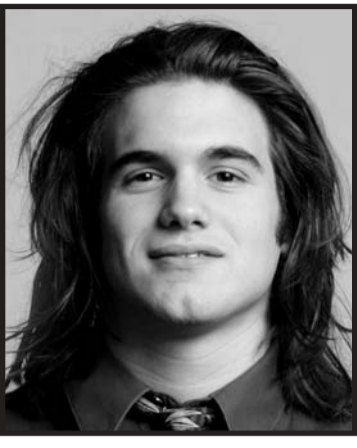


2005 All-State Boys Soccer



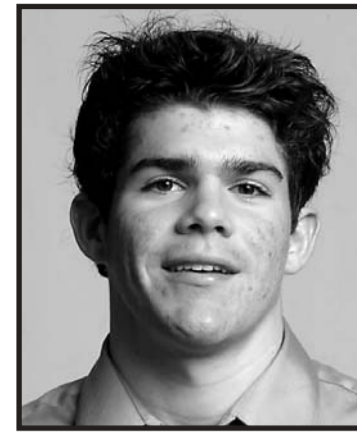
ANTHONY TAVARES
Senior, Goalie
East Providence

As the last line of defense, Tavares kept the Townies in nearly all of their games by using his athleticism to make some stellar saves. Tavares, a four-year starter, posted five shutouts, including two in the playoffs, and helped East Providence hold the state's best offense, La Salle, the country's sixth best team this season, to just one goal in their second meeting of the year. Voted first team All-Division and All-New England by the Coaches Association, Tavares (1.19 goals-against average) helped guide East Providence to an 8-9-4 record and a playoff berth.



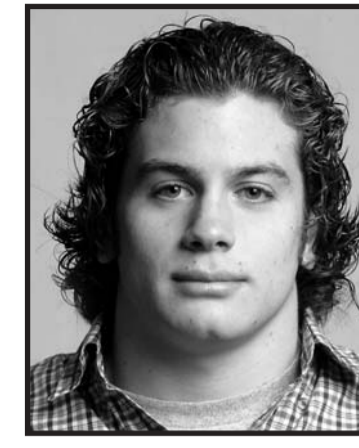
JONATHAN PEREIRA
Junior, Forward
La Salle

He is a skillful striker with a team-oriented mind. Pereira scored 17 goals and had 13 assists for 47 points for the season, with 5 game-winning goals. After getting an assist in La Salle's 1-0 quarterfinal victory over South Kingstown, Pereira scored three goals and had an assist in the Rams' 4-1 semifinal win against Portsmouth, and two goals in the finals against Cumberland to help La Salle win its sixth consecutive state championship via a 4-0 triumph. He was selected to the all-tournament team for his effort. Pereira is an Olympic Development Program Region 1 player and he has played international games in Argentina and Italy.



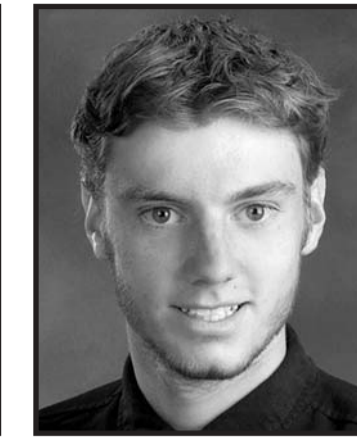
RYAN McCORMICK
Senior, Defender
La Salle

McCormick was a tri-captain at La Salle this year. He has started the last three years and was a leader on defense. A talented player with good speed and anticipation, McCormick's discipline and consistency played an important role in supporting the attack from the back position. McCormick helped the Rams' defense allow a Division I-low eight goals this season. Not only was he named to the RIIL all-tournament team, he was also an Olympic Development Program Region 1 pool player and is being recruited by several Division I schools.



DOM PETRARCA
Senior, Midfielder
La Salle

An All-Stater as a junior, Petrarca was a workhorse for the La Salle midfield during his senior season. He played defensive midfield and still managed to score 12 goals with 2 assists. Many of La Salle's opposing coaches considered him the Rams' toughest player. He is very strong in the air, has a very high work ethic, and is able to cover a large area of the field. Petrarca had a big role in La Salle's championship run and was a major reason the Rams finished the season ranked sixth in the country. He scored a goal in La Salle's 4-1 semifinal victory over Portsmouth and was named the state tournament's Most Valuable Player.



DAN GREEN
Senior,
Forward/Midfielder
North Kingstown

As North Kingstown's leading scorer, and one of the top forwards in the state, Green was marked every game but still managed to score 15 goals and dish out 4 assists for 34 points. A physical player who is strong in the air and quick with his feet, Green had a hand in 56 percent of the Skippers' goals this season, leading them to a 10-win season. A leader both on the soccer field and in the classroom, this honor-roll student is being recruited by several Ivy League schools.



ANDRES RUIZ
Senior, Midfielder
La Salle

An All-Stater as a junior, Ruiz is this year's National Soccer Coaches Association of America All-New England selection, picked by the Rhode Island Soccer Coaches Association. Ruiz is extremely skilled and has tremendous passing ability. The talented midfielder had 5 game-winning goals and finished the season with 12 goals and 13 assists for 37 points to help La Salle complete an undefeated season (18-0-2) and win its record-setting sixth consecutive state championship. Ruiz recorded two goals in La Salle's 4-0 state title victory over Cumberland.



NICK WILCOX
Senior, Midfielder
Chariho

As the leader of the Chargers this season, Wilcox booted in 16 regular-season goals, second-best in Division I, and added 2 assists to finish the season with 34 points. Strong-willed with excellent speed and a knack for scoring, Wilcox had a hand in 67 percent of Chariho's goals this season. He was voted first-team all-division by the Coaches Association.



JOSHUA SOUSA
Senior, Forward
Cumberland

As the most-feared forward in the RIIL this season, Sousa led the Clippers to a 14-3-0 regular-season record and all the way to the state championship game by scoring a Division I-best 19 goals with 4 assists. He also scored Cumberland's goal in its 1-0 semifinal victory over North Kingstown. Sousa, making his second consecutive All-State team, used his speed and foot skills to beat double-teams throughout the season. He is a National Soccer Coaches Association All-American as well.



MIKE DIOGO
Senior, Midfielder
Mt. Hope

After Mt. Hope began the season 0-5-1, Diogo helped turn the Huskies' season around by scoring 14 goals and handing out 6 assists as they went 6-2-3 in their last 11 games. Diogo is strong in the air and regularly beat defenders one-on-one. He was a sharpshooter from afar and deadly on short-range shots. Diogo was voted first-team all-division by the Coaches Association.



BRIAN WHITE
Senior,
Forward/Midfielder
South Kingstown

White was the Rebels' go-to guy this season. He led the Rebels in scoring with 14 goals and 8 assists to finish runner-up in Division I to Cumberland's Josh Sousa. Selected first-team all-division by the Coaches Association, as well, White's work ethic and determination to win led to success on the field. He had a helping hand in 61 percent of the Rebels' 36 regular-season goals.



BRIAN BATALAU
Senior, Defender
Cumberland

According to Cumberland coach John Lopes, Batalau was just as important to the Clippers' defense as All-American Joshua Sousa was to the Clippers' offense. Batalau often marked and shut down the opposing team's best offensive players. His defensive leadership helped Cumberland give up a Division I-Central low 16 goals this season, and he helped the Clippers win 16 games. He was voted first-team all-division and was named to the Division I all-tournament team in the playoffs.
